

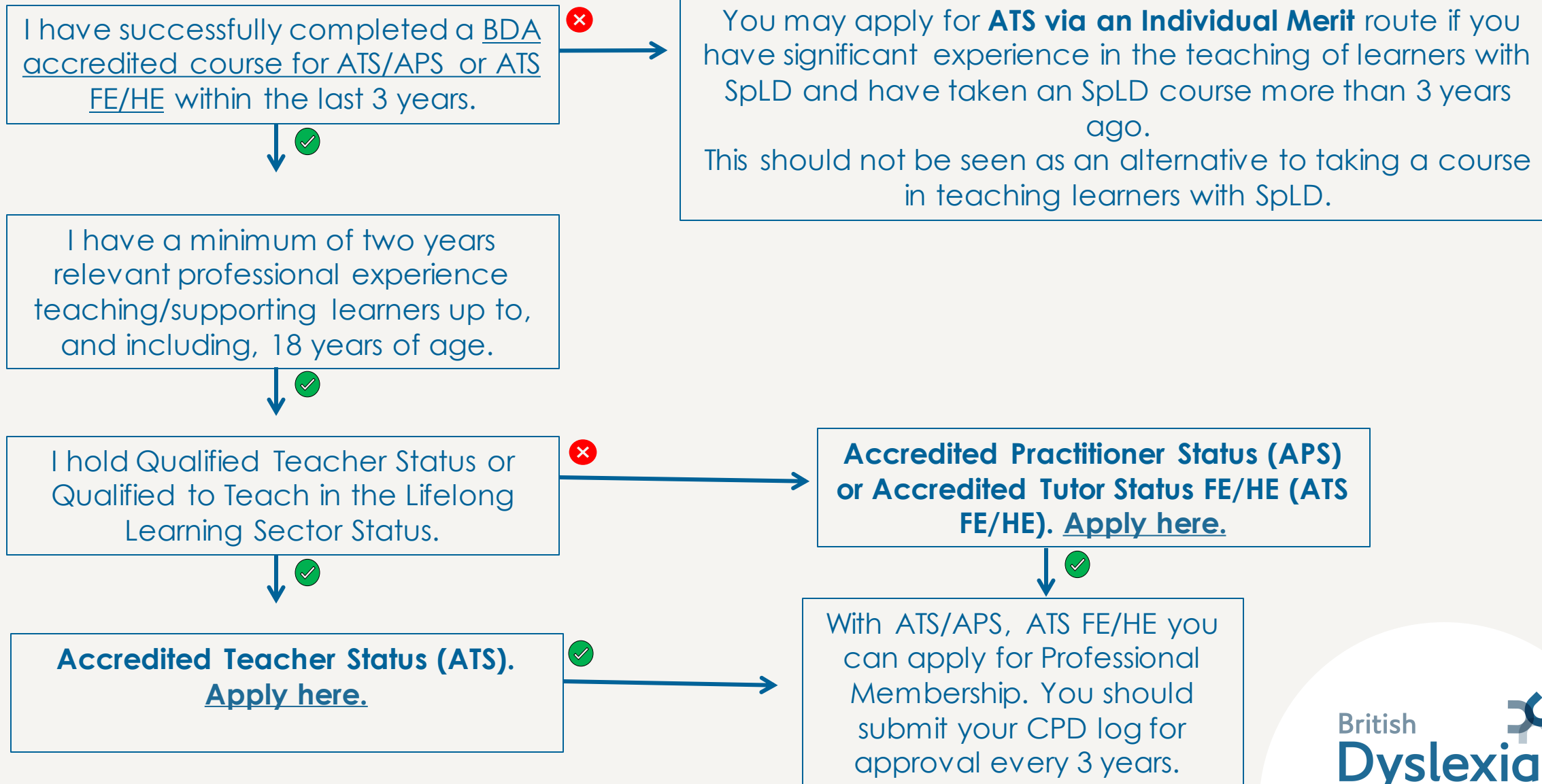


Routes to Professional Accreditation

For Specialist Teachers, Practitioners and Assessors



Routes to Accredited Teacher Status (ATS), Accredited Practitioner Status (APS) & Accredited Tutor Status FE/HE (ATS FE/HE)



Routes to Accredited Teacher Dyscalculia Status (ATD) & Accredited Practitioner Dyscalculia Status (APD)

I have successfully completed a BDA accredited course in teaching learners with specific learning difficulties/dyscalculia within the last 3 years



I have a minimum of two years relevant professional experience teaching/supporting learners up to, and including, 18 years of age



I hold Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) or Qualified to Teach in the Lifelong Learning Sector Status (QTLS)

Accredited Teacher Dyscalculia (ATD). Apply here.



With Active ATD & APD you may apply for **Professional Membership of the BDA** and be included on the BDA Tutor List.



Routes to AMBDA

I have completed an AMBDA accredited (level 7) postgraduate course or equivalent **within the last 3 years**



Apply for **AMBDA** here.

Routes to Assessment Practising Certificate (APC)

I have successfully completed an AMBDA accredited course or equivalent within 5 years of application



I hold AMBDA or Professional Membership



Apply for APC

An APC is valid for three years and needs to be renewed at the end of this 3 years.

Those holding an APC must commit to continuing professional development (CPD) and the BDA Code of Ethics.

All APC holders are listed on the SASC list of assessors.
